So what is a Neighbourhood Plan?

It is a plan which will give our Renhold Parish community a say on what they want the Parish to be like in the future, including what and where new housing development could take place.

Why does Renhold need one?

Bedford Borough Council's adopted Local Plan runs to 2030 and guides development across the Borough and surrounding Parishes. This Local Plan sets out the Council's wider policy considerations but does not necessarily address local concerns which are more appropriately addressed by way of a Neighbourhood Plan.

As residents of Renhold, it is important that we have a Neighbourhood Plan that helps us to shape and protect our Parish for the future.

With a plan in place, we have a stronger voice and, by Planning Law, we have to be listened to, for example by Bedford Borough Council and by developers.

Having an adopted Neighbourhood Plan will also provide us with opportunities to secure more community benefits.

What will be in the plan?

That is genuinely up to you and the community as a whole.

A Neighbourhood Plan must represent, and be led by, the views and needs of the community as a whole, not just the Parish Council.

As a starter, here are some of the topics you may wish to think about:

- * Leisure and Community facilities * Transport and Highways
- * Renewable Energy * Employment
- * Natural Environment
- * Sustainability
- * Housing * Health and Wellbeing * Services, incl. communications, utilities, energy, etc.
