Minutes of **MEETING of RENHOLD PARISH COUNCIL** held on **Monday 5<sup>th</sup> September 2011** at 7.30pm in the Committee Room of Renhold Village Hall.

**PRESENT**:- Parish Councillors, Mr. Andrews (Chair), Mrs. Dean, Mr. Stapleton, Mr. McDougall, the Clerk Mrs. Barnicoat and four members of the public.

- **1. WELCOME AND APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE TO BE RECEIVED:** Cllr. Andrews welcomed everyone to the meeting and thanked everyone for attending, Mr. Slater, Mr. Gurney, Mrs. Brunsden, Mr. Leydon, and Borough Councillors Ellis had sent apologies for absence, these were accepted.
- **2. DECLARATIONS OF PERSONAL AND PREJUDICIAL INTEREST:** No declarations of interest were received.

The Chairman adjourned the meeting for the next item.

#### 3. OPEN FORUM: -

Mr. Carpenter raised that the crab apple trees in Beecher Close need to be looked at by the Borough, Clerk to report.

The Chairman re-convened the meeting.

# 4. MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING:-

The minutes of the meeting held on 25<sup>th</sup> July had been circulated. The minutes were approved, unanimously agreed, resolution passed and signed by the Chair as a true and accurate record.

#### 5. MATTERS ARISING:-

The Clerk reported that some outstanding Register of Interest Forms to be dealt with, these were completed.

A reminder that forthcoming bulb planting date confirmed for Monday 24<sup>th</sup> October between 10am and 12 noon, as well as the Rural Bulky Waste Skip service will be in the village shortly and the Mayors village tour is taking place in Renhol on Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> September at 1-1.30pm at Green End/Woodfield Lane junction

# 6. BOROUGH COUNCILLORS REPORT: -

No report received.

#### 7. HIGHWAYS MATTERS WITHIN THE VILLAGE: -

- a) Information received relating to the previously proposed Heavy Goods Vehicle area wide ban in the north east of Bedford Borough information had been received and circulated to all that the Borough had agreed not to apply a weight limit regarding HGVs. The Borough Council had offered to send representatives to talk to the Parish Council about this and the Council discussed the best approach for this. It was agreed that the Clerk to arrange a meeting with a relevant Officer prior to the next Parish Council meeting, and that the same Officer be in attendance at the next Parish Council meeting so that a structured and agreed approach could be taken.
- b) Hand held speed device training and progress update the Clerk had looked into the insurance aspect and it is covered as volunteers are under the direction of the Parish Council and a frequently asked questions sheet from the Police had been circulated to all. It was agreed that the best approach to be to use the SID machine in the near future and that Cllr. Slater to be asked to write to

Police about this scenario as the Council is aware that the individual dealing with the coordinating of training for the new device is off on long term sick leave.

- c) Renhold Lower School and Church End parking update the Clerk reported that there had been no feedback from the Borough or Councillor Moon regarding the action points from the last meeting held. A resident had raised that the parking does continue to be hazardous and the problems are ongoing.
- d) Traffic management survey report relating to Traffic Regulation Order the data information had been received just prior to the meeting, it was felt that to be future agenda item to allow the Council to review the data fully.
- e) Other highway updates these included the recent bus changes, which Cllr. McDougall reported that Grant Palmer are very punctual, however, the lack of wheelchair access is of concern. Correspondence had been received from Highways Officer about 43 Green End, it had been inspected and no concerns were found, and it was reported that Ravensden Road recent surface works had not been levelled.
- **8. PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT: -** 11/01021/FUL first floor side extension at 27 Becher Close planning permission refused, 11/01436/FUL conversion of barns to form one dwelling at Harrison's Hill Farm, Water Lane planning permission granted

**OTHER PLANNING MATTERS**: - There had been correspondence received regarding consultation on national planning policies, Cllr. Slater had looked through the documentation and brief report contained within the correspondence folder for information. Correspondence received from Bedford Borough Planning Officers regarding Hill Farm was noted. Cllr. Stapleton reported that a resident in Ravensden Road had raised concern regarding a forthcoming planning application for a garage and they would be objection to it, when the Clerk receives the application to forward through the usual process.

# 9. RIGHTS OF WAY MATTERS IN THE PARISH:-

There had been concern raised regarding the lack of bollard or any object blocking vehicular access along the footpath work that are taking place near Cranborne Gardens at the Thor Drive end, a resident had highlighted that travelers could access the path. The Clerk had reported to the Greenspaces Manager at the Borough and would continue to chase.

A copy of the most up to date definitive map had been received from the Rights Of Way Department it was noted.

Cllr. Stapleton reported that a resident had agreed to empty a dog waste bin if there were to be one installed on the Sports Field, the Council discussed this and possible funds available, Clerk to look into regarding the Borough Councillor Ward Fund.

# 10. REPORTS FROM EVENTS COUNCILLORS HAVE ATTENDED:-

a) Willington Quarry tour – Cllr. Gurney gave detailed and informative report on recent visit to the quarry, highlighting the work that is ongoing and the restoration work that is also undertaken. It was noted that Councillors had been invited to the forthcoming.
